There are a number of companies that refill or recycle ink jet cartridges. Most provide prepaid mailing envelopes or boxes that are filled and mailed back. Depending on the make and model of the cartridge, they may also pay for them or make a donation to a designated school. Schools are beginning to use collection of cartridges as fundraisers. 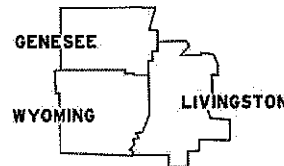

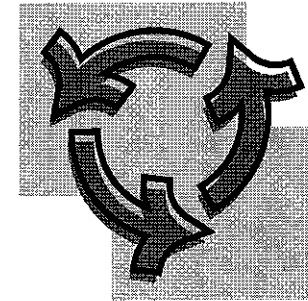

Cell Phone Recycling

Old cell phones should not be disposed of in landfills since they contain toxic materials that are harmful to our environment.

Instead of putting your old cell phone in a box in the basement, a junk drawer, or a closet, why not donate it? A national program, PROTECT, collects old cell phones for domestic violence agencies. They are then reprogrammed for use by their clients.

Under the New York State Wireless Recycling Act of 2007 all wireless telephone service providers must accept cell phones for reuse or recycling.
